

ZONING ISSUES RELATING TO RECREATIONAL VEHICLES

ADJOURN

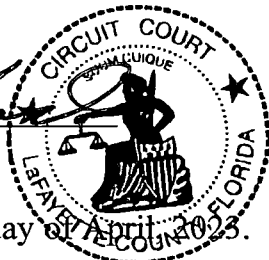
The Board agreed to adjourn the Workshop upon general consent.


